Marlboro Water Company wins Award at South Carolina Rural Water Association's 2025 Annual Conference

Columbia, SC- South Carolina Rural Water Association (SCRWA) recently held its 2025 Annual Conference at the Marriott Grande Dunes in Myrtle Beach, SC. This event brings hundreds of water and wastewater professionals together from across the southeast. The culminating event of the three-day conference was the Awards of Excellence Luncheon where awards were handed out to the state's top performing systems and professionals.

SCRWA Awards of Excellence selections were based on nominations from water and wastewater system personnel. Nominations included narratives describing why a system should be recognized for the award and were submitted to SCRWA's Awards Committee for selection.

There are 6 wells that supply Marlboro Water and they utilize water tanks to provide over one and a half million gallons of storage. Marlboro Water has interconnects with every water system available to them from Bennettsville, Clio, McColl, Wallace as well as Trico Water in order to supply backup water in the event of an emergency. Marlboro Water's motto is to provide "Quality on Tap" to their customers.
